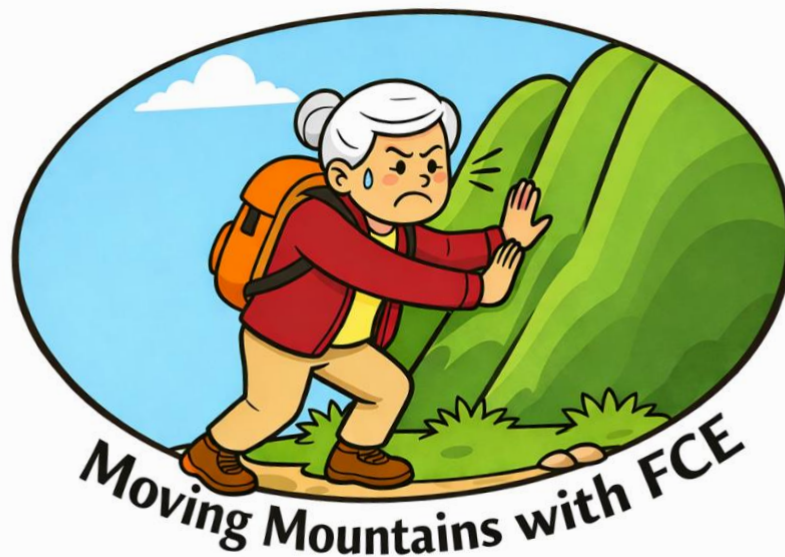

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TAFCE 2026 Conference Registration Help

Welcome to the 44th Annual TAFCE Conference in beautiful Gatlinburg. We hope these notes will help make your conference experience enjoyable and easy to navigate. This Conference is all about mountains and mountain living. You will enjoy mountain views, mountain music, and mountain food! Leave your fancy duds at home and bring your best overalls and aprons to enjoy the “vittles” at the Tuesday Night Mountain Supper. See all the pretty Christmas lights throughout the Sevier County Winterfest, marine life at the aquarium, and rollicking fun with the Red Skelton Tribute Theater. Get a Poke Sack full of useful items to take home. Oh, one more thing, “y’all” is Southern, “youins” is Mountain!!! So, youins come on!!

- **Black Bears are a REAL thing in Gatlinburg. Please DO NOT leave food in your vehicle, lock your vehicle, and DO NOT leave trash outside. While natives of the area, they are WILD ANIMALS and not pets. DO NOT APPROACH OR FEED THEM, it is illegal and dangerous to the animal and you!**
- If this is your first time attending a TAFCE Conference, there will be a class to help you immediately after the Monday morning Opening Session. Simply remain in the Joint Session Meeting Area on the second floor of the Conference Center for some tips from the TAFCE President and TAFCE Eastern Region President. Double check that you have indicated on your Registration Form that you are a “First-Timer” so your name will be in the hat for one of the TAFCE Board Alumni First-timer Scholarships.
- All forms that need to be returned are set to print with a blank page on the reverse meaning that you can remove them from your packet while still maintaining all the descriptive information you need.
- Complete your Registration Form, Consent for Photography Form, and County Designated Delegate Form for the Tuesday Business Meeting and send, along with your check, for your registration, conference pin, and meal fees, to the **TAFCE Treasurer**. The address is on the registration form.

- Complete the Tour, Educational Class, and Creative Class reservation forms and send, along with your check for Tours, to the **TAFCE Eastern Region Treasurer**. That address is on the reservation forms. Note that fees for Creative Classes will be paid to the TAFCE Hostess at the door of your class.
- If you have one, bring your TAFCE lanyard for your name tag. First time attendees will be given a lanyard. There will be some available for sale at the Registration Desk for returning attendees who forgot to bring theirs.
- If you are a County Council President, please make sure a brief, one to two sentences, introduction to your county and FCE status (clubs and members) is sent to Anita Ground, TAFCE IT Chair, agound1@yahoo.com, by October 1. These notes will be used to recognize your county during the Power Point presentation of the Parade of Flags in the Opening Session.
- Please plan to support the TAFCE Board Alumni Association and their philanthropic efforts by entering your bids in their Silent Auction. All items are donated by Alumni so the total proceeds are used for their projects. Winners of each item will be announced at the Tuesday night Supper and items may be collected immediately after the meal. No credit cards are accepted.
- Fashion Review and Cultural Arts entries will be accepted Sunday afternoon and Monday to 4PM. Judging will be held on Monday evening, entries may be viewed all day Tuesday until pickup times Tuesday afternoon, and winners will be announced via a Power Point Stream during the Tuesday night Mountain Supper. Awards will be available after the meal.
- NAFCE Members and prospective members should register for the Educational Class led by Pat Woods, NAFCE Public Policy Coordinator #1 and Bonnie Teeples, NAFCE President. They will share the happenings in our national partner organization and share why NAFCE membership can enhance your FCE experience.
- To fulfill our mission of Community Service, this conference will financially support The Wears Valley Ranch and St. Andrews School. This facility

provides housing and education in a faith-based environment for children in difficult situations that the child did not create. You will learn more about their mission and activities during the Opening Session.

- Note that some classes have attendance limits. This is on a first-reserved, first-served basis. The earlier your reservations are received, the better your chance of being included. Note also, that some classes are offered twice during the conference. Be mindful of those classes that extend for 1 ½-2 hours and adjust your scheduling to allow your time for those.

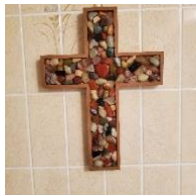

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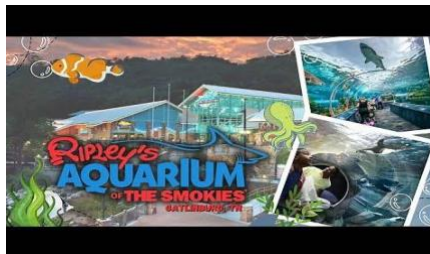
